

Treatment of Psoriasis with REGENERESEN® - an Example for Varying Therapeutical Success

Psoriasis is an intermittent disease whose exact pathogenesis till now is not known, so that a causal therapy is not possible. The strong desquamation greatly impairs the patients' life quality, more often than not leading to suicide or suicidal attempts.

The referent treated several cases of psoriasis with REGENERESEN with varying success. In some cases the results were excellent, with a reduction of efflorescences and exsudations, so that a normal life could be resumed by the patients. One case, though, appearing identically with the others, resisted the treatment.

The referent usually applies 5 ampoules each of *RN 13* and *skin*, for a first treatment as well as on relapses. In a case of arthritis psoriatica he used *RN 13*, *cartilage*, and *synovia* with good success.

With another case, after the successful treatment of psoriasis, a malignant cerebral tumor was diagnosed. By the application of the REGENERESEN *RN 13* and *bone marrow* the patient's blood count, heavily depressed by the chemotherapy of the tumor, could be bettered significantly. The patient thus could be spared some stressing longer hospital-stays.
